#### SCHOOL ACTION PLAN

### <u>Technology/Hybrid Teaching</u>

 Staff members continue to be offered professional development specific to teaching and learning in the hybrid (blended) model. As we gradually become more familiar and secure in this model, we continue to evolve our skills with regards to technology, lesson planning, instruction, and assessment.

## Coding Pilot Project in Grade 7 and 8 (facilitated by the board)

- The Creation Camp Focus In Coding program teaches students the Ontario expectations of coding and SEL. The program does this by bringing in real-world professionals (engineers, game-designers and entrepreneurs) working in the industry to teach students virtually how to code applications and computer games to build prototypes of real-world technological innovations. The students are also taught SEL strategies to problem-solve through the projects.
- The program aims to introduce students to various career pathways that utilize coding, and SEL strategies. The Creation Camp programs pedagogical approach is centered around 21st century skills and global competencies.

#### Indigenous Initiatives

- Grade 1 and Grade 4 French Immersion participating in a board pilot program
- Holiday Cards of Hope for Neskantaga First Nation, an Ojibwe community located 436 kilometers northeast of Thunder Bay, Ontario who were transported from their homes in late October after an oily sheen was found in the Neskantaga water.

## Other Items

- Mrs. Linardic asked C. Ferrari to speak more about the Indigenous projects underway:
  - explain a pilot project underway with an Indigenous consultant, talking about "Opening Address" by First
    Nations people which they recite before anything is done, to give thanks & gratitude for everything from
    (literally) the ground up to the sky. Looking at how to bring this into the entire schools & incorporate into
    the curriculum. C. Ferrari & Deveaux-Matthews already starting to incorporate into their own classes.
  - Looking to have guest speakers in January.
  - Some classes are creating holiday cards in class for the Indigenous communities displaced by the water crisis. It's not a mandatory activity, all teachers are welcomed to have their class participate if they choose to.
- V. Frantellizi -- There's a lot of focus on the Indigenous community, but is there anything being done regarding anti-Black racism in the school such as training for staff, text books, guest speakers, special programs, etc.
  - Mrs. Linardic -- yes there are. The projects/initiatives focused on the Indigenous community is fairly new, but anti-Black racism projects/initiatives have been ongoing.
- Mr. Birnie -- asked Mrs. Linardic if she thinks the class size numbers for in-person students have gone down?
  - o Mrs. Linardic -- no, we are pretty close to what the numbers were before the re-organization of Hybrid & Remote Only models. Classes fluctuate with the number of students in class vs online, but the total students per class hasn't changed very much. The challenge with the flexibility of the Hybrid model ability to switch between in-person & online, is some families regularly frequently change back & forth.
- C. Calabrese -- Nov. 28th there were virtual meetings for training for all Catholic School Council executive members. They should be available online now for anyone who missed it.

# Treasury Report (T. Rossi)

- T. Rossi emailed Sept. & Oct. Treasurer Report to Council members earlier today. The Oct. report showed the previously approved unused funds from last school year allocated to purchases/events for this current year & next year.
- The floor was open for any questions, none raised.

# **Fundraising** (C. Calabrese)

- C. Calabrese talked about current fundraiser with FlipGive.
  - Mrs. Vitale & T. Rossi mentioned finding out that certain stores offer only certain items count towards fundraiser to school. Example: Amazon gift cards count towards fundraising but some items don't
- A. Baltazar updated Council that so far \$295 has been raised for the school
- C. Calabrese & A. Baltazar to work on an updated message to send out to the school community about this fundraiser.
- C. Calabrese mentioned another fundraising idea (brought forth by A. Baltazar), like Dominos pizza offers \$5 towards school for every pizza purchased
  - all Council members present voted in favour of C. Calabrese to looking into further
- Mrs. Vitale proposed a fundraiser: soup in a bottle/jar
- C. Calabrese asked about school Spirit Wear
  - Mrs. Linardic will look into when we'd be able to get product, when would be a good time to present to parents, & if they can ship direct to individual homes since we can't hold them at the school for personal pickups
- A. Baltazar presented the OAPCE update:
  - o pandemic webinar held in November is now available online
  - Dec. 14th is a virtual Family Fun Night for school community to create artwork.
